## **Parish News**

This coming Tuesday, September 29, is the **feast of the archangels**, which offers us an opportunity to reflect upon the role of the angels—so often misunderstood or overlooked—in God’s plan of salvation. The United States Catholic Catechism for Adults explains that, in addition to the visible world, God created “a realm of spiritual beings who do not share the limitations of a physical body, and yet exist as the result of His all-powerful, loving act of creation” (54). We can see that God created some things that are purely physical and material, and persons such as ourselves who are composed of both body and soul, and so it stands to reason that He would have also created some beings that are purely spiritual. We call these creatures “angels.” “With their whole beings the angels are servants and messengers of God” (Catechism of the Catholic Church 329). They worship Him and sing His glory and watch over and protect His Church on earth.

The Church celebrates three angels in a particular way: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. Saint Michael is the leader of the angelic host, who, according to the Book of Daniel, defends God’s chosen people from their enemies and, according to the Book of Revelation, leads the armies of God to victory over the forces of evil. Saint Gabriel is God’s messenger, who announced to Saint Zechariah the birth of John the Baptist and to the Blessed Virgin the birth of Christ. Saint Raphael, according to the Book of Tobit, accompanied Tobias on his journey through the desert and healed his father’s blindness.

The archangels are powerful protectors and friends as we live out our Catholic faith. Let’s ask Saint Raphael to pray that we might accompany others with compassion and mercy, Saint Gabriel that we might always boldly announce the good news of the Gospel, and Saint Michael that we might never tire of standing up for what is good and true.

- Please dispose of music sheets and do not leave them in the pews or attempt to return them.
- All nonessential meetings remain suspended.

Unfortunately we will not be able to do Oktoberfish this year, but we are hoping and planning to come back strong next Lent.
