This ministry raises awareness of the many ways our Church can support the nearly 10,000 children in Kentucky's child protection system. As St. Joseph accepted the task of fostering Jesus, we too can care for children in need. This role can take many forms: Perhaps full-time fostering, or adopting, or supporting such a family. St. Joseph Ministry's fundamental mission is to help recruit new families to care for children and then have our church family wrap a loving embrace around each foster/adoptive parent and child.

We are asking parishioners to please recite the *Prayer for Foster Children* directed to St. Joseph's mighty intercession. We also are in need of help with recruiting and sharing the message about the need for more foster and adoptive parents. We have car magnets and yard signs available to help share our message. We also have larger signs that are rotated throughout northern Kentucky on a monthly or monthly basis. Additionally, we would like to know anyone from our parish who is already involved with fostering, adopting, relative or guardian care of a child. - Every other pew is closed. Do not move the ropes in order to sit in a closed pew. If the pews are filled, there is seating available in the choir loft.
