Parish News

This coming Tuesday, February 2nd, the Church celebrates the feast of the **Presentation of the Lord**. We remember in this celebration the day when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to dedicate Him to God, which was required by the law in the case of all firstborn sons. In obeying this law, Mary and Joseph also fulfilled it: the “firstborn” Son of God, whose entire being is loving dedication to the Father, is offered up to God (a sacrifice that He Himself would bring to completion upon the Cross thirty-three years later); the Child who is both fully human and fully divine enters into the Temple, the meeting place of God and man. Simeon, described by St. Luke as righteous and devout, recognizes that the ancient prophecies and promises made to God’s People had been brought to fulfillment in Christ. He proclaims, “Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.” We too have beheld this light of salvation dawning upon our lives. And it’s only by walking in this light that we too are able to “go in peace,” to be reconciled to the Father by living like His Son: dedicated to the Lord with undivided hearts and firmly committed to obeying His will.

Safety Protocols

As you know, we are still observing several health and safety directives mandated by the bishop in response to concerns about the coronavirus. As time goes on, we all could benefit from some reminders:

- Masks must be worn inside church when attending liturgies. The mask must cover the mouth and nose. There are exceptions for

- Every other pew is closed. Do not move the ropes in order to sit in a closed pew. If the pews are filled, there is seating available in the choir loft.
- Maintain distance from other families when seated and when moving around the church.
- Please dispose of music sheets and do not leave them in the pews or attempt to return them.
- All nonessential meetings remain suspended.
