In the Gospel reading at Mass last Sunday, we heard St. Peter's great confession of faith: "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." This Sunday, we hear about the events that immediately followed that moment. The Lord explains to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem to suffer and die, and then be raised on the third day. Peter pulls Him aside and says, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." How quickly things change! How quickly Peter falls from His great insight into the Lord's identity and mission to this attempt at telling God who He should be and how He should act.

How often do we do the same? How often do our good intentions give way to attempts at limiting the Lord by telling Him where He's allowed to lead us and how He's allowed to change us? Like Peter, we all at times can be far too prone to think as men do, rather than as God does. But for God all things are possible. When we truly allow Him to lead us, when we get behind Him and follow Him, He will bring us to heights of holiness and happiness that we could never imagine on our own. Let's pray for the faith to set aside our all-too-human attempts at restricting God with our fears and doubts, and instead follow Him unreservedly to the new life that He desires to share with all of us.

Masks

The governor of Kentucky has mandated that masks be worn indoors under certain circumstances. Bishop Foys has responded by updating our diocesan protocols to require that all those attending liturgies in all churches in our diocese wear a face covering, unless the person is under 5 or has a medical reason preventing him from wearing a mask. Of course, people performing liturgical ministries may remove the mask in order to perform their duties. We continue to ask that you please lower your mask before receiving Holy Communion. We will try to have masks available in the vestibule of the church, in case someone forgets a mask or is unable to find one, but please try to bring one from home.

Our main concern at the parish is that we remain able to worship God and celebrate the sacraments. To that end, we have to comply with the relevant mandates from the diocese and the government in order to remain open and continue to fulfill our mission.
