Our annual **cemetery visitation** takes place today, Sunday, October 4th, at 2 PM. We will begin in the church by praying the Office for the Dead, and then proceed down to the cemetery. Prayer for the faithful departed has always been an important part of our faith. The Resurrection of Christ reveals to us that our relationships with our family and friends who have died are not ended, but rather changed. Now that relationship is expressed in prayer, as we look forward in hope to the day when we will see them again and together sing God's praises eternally. Whether you can join us here this afternoon or not, please take some time to pray for our departed parishioners, those who are buried in our cemetery, and for all the faithful departed.

During the month of October, parishes in our diocese count the number of people at weekend Masses in order to determine our "weekly attendance." Of course, given the current health concerns of many people and the present dispensation from the Sunday obligation, those numbers will presumably be on the low side this year. Nevertheless, this is a good opportunity to remember that our attendance and participation at the Mass is the source and summit of our lives. The Mass is the very Sacrifice of Calvary, the Lord offering up His own Body and Blood to take away our sins and reconcile us to the Father. To be present and unite ourselves to that sacrifice is the highest honor imaginable and the greatest source of grace available to us. When serious circumstances prevent us from being able to attend Mass, we should recognize it as a true loss and strive to unite ourselves to it in prayer as best we can. So, let's renew our love for the Mass and resolve to participate in the sacred mysteries as often as we can. There's no better way to stay close to God and share in His life and love.
