Parish News

As announced at the Masses last weekend, Bishop Foys has updated our diocesan coronavirus protocols in light of new guidance from the CDC and new directives from the state. Masks and social distancing are no longer required in church for those who are vaccinated; those who are not vaccinated are asked to continue wearing masks for the time being. Holy water is once again available in the fonts in church. Starting in June, we'll have servers at our weekend Masses and begin having the Offertory Procession once more. We are still not permitted to offer Holy Communion under the appearance of wine, but when we receive even the smallest fragment of the Host, we receive Christ's Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, no less than when we receive under both forms. In other words, we're taking some big steps back to normal. I appreciate your cooperation with the diocesan protocols over the last year. I know that they could be cumbersome and, even if we understood them, certainly none of us enjoyed them. Everyone's had to sacrifice in one way or another over the past year. Of course, sacrifice is always a part of our lives, and when we offer those sacrifices to God with faith and love, they help us to become more like Him, who gave His life for our salvation. So, thanks for patiently and faithfully making those sacrifices and thanks be to God for these recent steps back towards normalcy.

In light of all that progress, it seems to be a good time to remind everyone that we could always use more ministers to assist at our weekend Masses, especially servers, ushers, and readers. If you're interested in helping in any of those ways, please let me know. As a reminder, all volunteers have to complete the diocesan safe environment training.

And let's not forget that we celebrate this Sunday the great solemnity of **Pentecost**, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. It was on this day, so many years ago, that God brought the Church to life by filling her with His Love. After the Lord's arrest, His disciples fled to the Upper Room for refuge, paralyzed by the fear that they would be made to

suffer His fate. Even after the Resurrection, still they suffered from fear and misunderstanding. But now, as they are filled with the Holy Spirit, they go out of the Upper Room to boldly proclaim the Gospel of Christ to people of every nation. Commenting on this phenomenon, Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "They were not afraid because they felt they were in the hands of the Strongest One. Yes, wherever the Spirit of God enters He puts fear to flight; He makes us know and feel that we are in the hands of an Omnipotence of Love" (*Pentecost Homily*, May 31, 2009). Let us pray that we too may know that we are held secure in God's love and find in that knowledge the strength and fortitude to boldly live out our Catholic faith and bear witness to Christ before all.
