## **Parish News**

In the Gospel reading this Sunday, the Lord asks His disciples a life-changing question: “Who do you say that I am?” Our answer to this question will change everything, if our answer is sincere. When Jesus first posed this question to His disciples, there were many competing opinions among the populace. Some said He was John the Baptist, others the prophet Elijah, or one of the other prophets from the Old Testament. Throughout history, and in our day too, the world has offered many conflicting answers to the question of the identity of Jesus. We’ve probably all heard some of the modern answers to His question. Some today would say that Jesus was just a philosopher or moral teacher, others that He was really only a political or social revolutionary.

What sets Christians apart from these people and from the rest of the world is our answer to Jesus’ question, “Who do you say that I am?” We join with Saint Peter in his great confession of faith, professing that Jesus is “the Christ, the Son of the living God.” If we take that answer seriously, then we have to acknowledge Jesus as the Lord of our lives. Often we like to try to hold some part back for ourselves, to tell God that He can rule over some parts of our lives, but not others. But, in Jesus, God has given us His whole self in complete self-offering. We, in return, can offer Him nothing less than our whole selves, allowing Him to reign as King in our hearts over the whole of our lives. Let’s pray in the week ahead that every aspect of our lives will proclaim that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, the King of all creation.

### **Masks**

The governor of Kentucky has mandated that masks be worn indoors under certain circumstances. Bishop Foys has responded by updating our diocesan protocols to require that all those attending liturgies in all churches in our diocese wear a face covering, unless the person is under 5 or has a medical reason preventing him from wearing a mask. Of course, people performing liturgical ministries may remove the mask in order to perform their duties. We continue to ask that you please lower your mask before receiving Holy Communion. We will try to have masks available in the vestibule of the church, in case someone forgets a mask or is unable to find one, but please try to bring one from home.

Our main concern at the parish is that we remain able to worship God and celebrate the sacraments. To that end, we have to comply with the relevant mandates from the diocese and the government in order to remain open and continue to fulfill our mission.
